Dear Parents/Guardians,

HIGHLIGHTS FROM TERM 1

- 1. The Start Right Programme allowed our teachers to check in with Crestans on their socio-emotional well-being after a long break. It was also a time to help our Sec 1 students transit smoothly from primary school to secondary school. Through a range of activities, our Crestans bonded with one another, while learning how to support their peers. We were heartened to see the seniors stepping up to help the Sec 1 students, especially when they advised their juniors regarding CCA options. Teachers also used this time to understand the needs of our Crestans' families better through home visits. With clear expectations set in the Start Right Programme, Crestans were ready to start the new year on the right foot!
- Our Co-Curricular Activities (CCA) and sports programme provided Crestans a chance to explore their interests and passions, as well as develop important life skills such as teamwork, problem-solving, and communication. We observed much enthusiasm from Crestans when students from the Sports CCAs represented the school at the National School Games (NSG) in February 2024.
- A Class Committee Ceremony was also conducted to recognise the different leadership
 roles our Crestans take up in the classroom. It was a proud moment for them as our
 School Leaders, Heads of Department, and Form Teachers personally pinned the
 leadership badges onto our Crestans' uniform.
- 4. During the Chinese New Year celebration, we continued our unique Crest tradition—Crestan Lions. Innovatively designed with recycled materials by the Sec 2 students, the Crestan Lions always bring much joy and laughter to everyone, staff and students alike.
- 5. We ended Term 1 with the Keep Right Programme. Fun activities were planned for our students to lead them to reflect on Term 1. The Sec 1 students enjoyed the Freshman Adventure Camp with their classmates and bonded well at this overnight camp that ended spectacularly with a campfire! The Sec 2s had their Go Overseas And Learn (GOAL) programme where they had a cultural immersion experience through hands-on activities in Cambodia, Vietnam, or Sarawak. For the Sec 3s, they participated in the Frisbee interclass games, and learned how to apply their Mathematics concepts at the Gardens By the Bay. The Sec 4s had a great time giving back to the community through a range of class-based Values-In-Action (VIA) projects and visited various companies as part of their Education and Career Guidance (ECG) Learning Journey.
- 6. In short, Term 1 was an exciting and productive term, and I am pleased to share that the Crestans have been making excellent progress.

UPCOMING PROGRAMMES AND ACTIVITIES IN TERM 2

7. We attach the **Term 2 Schedule of Key Programmes and Activities (Annex A)** for your reference. Some of the key programmes and activities are highlighted in the rest of this letter.

STUDENT COUNCIL INVESTITURE

8. The Student Council Investiture will take place on 8 May 2024, Wednesday. On this day, our Sec 2 students will be officially appointed as Student Councillors, and several Sec 3 students will be taking on Executive Committee (ExCo) and Senior Councillor positions. During the investiture, we will also be presenting Certificates of Appreciation to our Sec 4 Student Councillors to thank them for their service to the school. We wish them the very best as they hand over their duties to their juniors and focus on preparing for their national examinations.

CREST AWARDS DAY 2024

9. We will be holding our annual Crest Awards Day, and the details are summarised in the table below.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION (PE) & CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES (CCA)

- 10. All Secondary 2 and 4 students will take the National Physical Fitness Award (NAPFA) Test in Term 2. The test comprises six stations, including a 2.4 km run. Students will be provided with ample opportunities to build up their fitness gradually, and the test will be conducted from 29 April 2024 to 17 May 2024 (Term 2 Week 7 to Week 9) during PE lessons.
- 11. There will be a school **Sports Day** on 23 May 2024, Thursday, at Millennia Institute. Students will report directly to the venue. More details will be provided closer to the date.
- 12. A CCA Leaders Investiture will be conducted on 17 May 2024, Friday to recognize the Secondary 4 students for their contributions in their respective CCAs, and officially appoint the Secondary 3 CCA leaders. All Secondary 4 students will step down from CCA at the end of Term 2 to prepare for their National Examinations.

SECONDARY 1 TO 4 TERM 2 ASSESSMENTS AND GCE N-LEVELS EXAM TIMETABLE

- 13. There will be no mid-year examination for all Secondary 1 to 4 students. In its place will be a termly Weighted Assessment for academic subjects, which will be held from 22 April to 10 May (Term 2 Week 6 to Week 8). Details will be provided by the subject teachers.
- 14. In preparation for the GCE N-Level examinations, Secondary 4 students will sit for their EL oral examination simulation, as well as the preliminary oral examination for both EL and MTL in Term 2. The details are shared in the **Term 2 Assessment Schedule** (Annex B).

15. The 2024 GCE N-Level examinations timetable (as of 8 March 2024) has been published by Singapore Examinations and Assessment Board (SEAB), please refer to **GCE N-Levels Examinations Timetable (Annex C)**.

AESTHETICS PROGRAMME

- 16. Sec 1 students will be experiencing the 'Shake it Up' Cajon and Stomp Percussion Programme during their Music and Dance curriculum. Students will be learning how to play the cajon and create percussive rhythms using recycled items, thereafter integrating their rhythmic composition into a dance routine. The intentional use of recycled items is also to educate our students on the importance of sustainability. The programme will culminate with a showcase on the 24 April 2024, Wednesday, during our school assembly. All Sec 1 students will receive a certificate of participation, in addition to the following awards:
 - Most improved student (1 per class)
 - Best performer (1 per class)
 - Class resilience award (4 for the whole cohort)
 - Best class performance (3 for the whole cohort)
- 17. The Sec Two cohort will be going through the **Artist-In-School Scheme (AISS)**. This programme that spans across Terms 1 and 2 (29 January 5 Apr 2024) is co-designed with local artists who will coach the students in engaging the community through digital art. Students will be visiting Yuhua Village and the community centre during their Art curriculum time to create illustrations, comic artworks and portraits of the residents in Yuhua. The artworks will eventually be presented to the Yuhua Community and displayed in school.
- 18. The Visual Arts Club will be participating in the upcoming **Singapore Youth Festival** 2024 Art Exhibition. We wish them a fruitful learning experience.

IGNITE SKILLS CHALLENGE 2024

20. Organised by the Institute of Technical Education (ITE), the IgnITE Skills Challenge is an annual national competition for students in the Normal Course. The objectives of the competition are to introduce students to technical skills and to foster a deeper understanding of courses offered by ITE. Challenges are designed to be engaging and fun, so as to make learning enjoyable and memorable. This year, Crest will be sending 18 teams to participate in challenges across 11 categories. Workshops to equip students with the relevant skills for the challenges will be conducted by ITE from 7 Mar 2024 to 28 Mar 2024. Thereafter, the preliminary rounds will be held from 15, 16 & 17 Apr 2024. The finals, for teams that make it through the preliminary round, will be held on 21 May 2024, Tuesday. We wish our teams the very best in the competition.

INDUSTRY EXPERIENTIAL PROGRAMME

21. Secondary 3 students will be undergoing their Industry Experiential Programme (IEP) from 21 October 2024 to 16 November 2024 where each student will be attached to a company to undergo industry exposure. To qualify for ITE Skills Subject Certificate (ISSC), students have to complete the IEP.

A selection process will be put in place by our partner companies in Terms 2 and 3. Students will be informed of the date and time of their interviews.

We strongly encourage the students to open a bank account under their names by the end of March as the companies will need these details for the crediting of their IEP allowance. More details of the IEP will be sent via PG at the start of Term 2.

SCHOOL & MISCELLANEOUS FEES
