#### START OF 2024 - KEY EVENTS & PROGRAMMES IN TERM 1

### **WELCOME BACK AND GREETINGS FOR 2024**

- 1. I am delighted to extend my warmest greetings as I officially begin my role as the third Principal of Crest Secondary, effective from 15 December 2023. It is truly an honour and a privilege to be part of this vibrant school community. My primary goal is to provide unwavering support to your child/ward, assisting them in achieving their full potential and success. I want to express my gratitude to the out-going Principal, Mr Seet Tiat Hee, for his dedicated service and contributions over the last six years. I am looking forward to working closely with you and your child/ward. Together, let's empower your child/ward to realise their dreams. I am fully committed to maintaining Crest Secondary as a welcoming and inspiring place for your child to learn and grow. Here's to a future filled with success and growth for all our students!
- 2. We are pleased to share that our 8<sup>th</sup> batch of Crestans from the Class of 2023 have performed reasonably well for the GCE N-Level Examination and the ITE Skills Subject Certificate (ISSC) courses. 95.2% of our 207 graduating students were awarded the GCE N(T) Certificate while 92.4% were awarded the ITE Skills Subject Certificate (ISSC). In addition, 60% of our students have secured a place in a course of their choice at ITE. We wish the Class of 2023 all the best in ITE, and like many of their seniors, progress to diploma courses at ITE/Polytechnics in the years ahead.
- 3. We congratulate the 159 new Secondary 1 students who secured a place in Crest Secondary School. We would also like to welcome our Secondary 2 to 4 Crestans back to another exciting year of learning and growth.
- 4. For 2024, we can look forward to activities planned for all students, so that the value proposition of a unique education path in Crest can be fully experienced by all Crestans. A list of these key events and programmes in Term 1 is shared in **Annex A**. Details of other major events and programmes are also shared in the rest of this letter.

#### **ENHANCING INFRASTRUCTURE AND FACILITIES**

6. As part of our ongoing commitment to providing a conducive learning environment for our students, the school has embarked on a significant project to upgrade some of the school's facilities and infrastructure. Since the start of the Nov/Dec school holidays in 2023, the school commenced the upgrading of the school canteen, cafe, Student Hub, parade square, multipurpose hall, and foyer areas. While some of these works will continue into the upcoming school term, rest assured that the school, together with the upgrading project personnel and contractor specialist teams, has implemented necessary measures to minimize any impact to the functional

- use of these spaces. In instances where needed, localised hoarding/temporary protection will be erected to ensure the safety and security of our students and staff.
- 7. Throughout this upgrading period until 2025, we seek the support and understanding of our various stakeholders. The school is actively working to minimise inconveniences for our students, which may include occasional construction noise, as well as vehicular re-routing where needed. We believe these enhancements will not only enrich our students' educational experience but also contribute to creating a more inviting and stimulating environment.

### **STUDENT MATTERS**

### **START RIGHT PROGRAMME 2024**

- 8. The Start Right Programme is a special transition programme for all our Crestans which will be conducted from 2 to 5 January 2024, Tuesday to Friday (Week 1). During the Start Right Week, students will be re-orientated back to school routines and expectations after a long break. It is also a time for our teachers to check in with the students on how they are feeling. The reporting time will be as per normal at 7:45 am. The dismissal time for the Start Right Week for all levels will be at 12:15 pm.
- 9. As part of our school's continuing efforts to stay connected and strengthen school-family relationships, Form Teachers will make home visits to engage parents/guardians during the Start Right Week and through the year. We hope to work very closely with you in the best interest of your child/ward. We look forward to your support when our Form Teachers make home visits to you or your child/ward.
- 10. Normal curriculum will commence for all levels from **8 January 2024, Monday**, onwards following the students' respective timetables.

## **TEMPERATURE-TAKING EXERCISE**

11. Term 1 temperature-taking exercise will be held on 10 January 2024, Wednesday. This exercise aims to ensure that the school is prepared to activate the temperature-taking regime promptly if the need arises, and to educate students on taking responsibility for their own health. All Sec 2 to 4 students are to bring their Oral Digital Thermometers (ODT) on 8 January 2024, Monday, for serviceability check by their Form Teachers. By 8 January 2024, Monday, all Secondary 1 students will be issued a new thermometer by the school.

#### **CREST FRESHMEN ADVENTURE CAMP**

12. The overnight Secondary 1 camp will be held at the school, and it will be based on our school values, aiming to equip our students with socio-emotional learning competencies and skills. The camp hopes to enable Secondary 1 students to adapt well in a secondary school environment and raise the students' self-awareness, as well as improve their self-management. The teambased activities will foster strong peer relationships, identity within the class and as a cohort. We hope that the Sec 1s will emerge stronger together after the 4 days and 2 nights with a higher level of confidence, motivation, resilience and leadership.

To give our Secondary 1 and new transfer-in students a better understanding of the CCAs, a CCA Exposure Programme will be conducted on 5 and 12 January, where students will learn about the different CCAs.

#### REMEDIATION PROGRAMME FOR SECONDARY 2 TO 4 STUDENTS

17. Remediation programme will be conducted for selected Secondary 2 to 4 students who did not pass the English Language, Mathematics or Mother Tongue Language examinations in 2023. The programme aims to strengthen these students' academic foundation, so as to help them do better in school. The remediation programme will be held weekly and will start from **5 February 2024 (Term 1 Week 6)** onwards, as follows:

### **TERM 1 ASSESSMENTS**

18. Various Weighted Assessments (WA) will be conducted in Term 1. These serve as important checkpoints for our students' learning. Besides pen-and-paper tests, students will also be assessed via alternative modes such as practical assessments, presentations and projects. The assessment schedule is appended below for your reference:

Note: Assessment for Secondary 1 to 2 Vocational Taster Modules will only be carried out in Term 2, while practical assessment for Secondary 3 to 4 ISS subjects will be conducted on an on-going basis.

### CHINESE NEW YEAR (CNY) CELEBRATIONS

19. The 2024 CNY festive holidays will stretch from 10 to 13 February, Saturday to Tuesday. The school will be celebrating CNY on **9 February 2024 (Friday)**. Students will report to school at 7:45am and will be dismissed at 10:30am. We encourage all students to don either Chinese ethnic costumes or red tops to enhance the festive mood. School will resume on 14 February 2024, Wednesday.

## HEALTHY MEALS IN SCHOOLS PROGRAMME (HMSP) AND INCREASE IN FOOD AND DRINK PRICES/ CONSUMPTION OF WATER

- 20. To support our students' health development, the school is on board the Healthy Meals in Schools Programme (HMSP) by the Health Promotion Board (HPB). This programme provides food service guidelines for school canteens and aims to cultivate good eating habits among our students, so that they will be accustomed to consuming fruit, vegetables, and whole grains as part of their daily diet. Given the continuing inflationary trend in food prices, the school needs to balance the affordability of the canteen prices with the sustainability of our canteen stallholders. As such, there will be a 10-cent to 20-cent increase in the prices of selected food and drinks items. All prices of the set meals, sides, snacks, and drinks are clearly displayed at the canteen stalls. Healthy set meals will be provided in the school canteen with prices ranging from \$3.00 to \$4.00. We seek your support and understanding in this matter, and we encourage your child/ward to eat healthily.
- 21. We also encourage our students to consume water on a regular basis throughout the day as our weather is hot and humid. As proper hydration is important, we strongly encourage all students to bring **their own water bottle** to school. There are many water coolers around the school where students can fill up their water bottles.

### **KEEPING IN TOUCH WITH THE SCHOOL**

- 22. It is important to develop and strengthen mutual understanding, respect and trust between the school and parents to ensure the well-being and holistic development of the child. To allow time for our teachers to rest and recharge, we seek the kind cooperation of parents to limit communication with teachers within school operating hours (7.30am to 5.30pm) on working weekdays during school terms. Teachers are not expected to respond to parents' and/or students' queries after school operating hours, during weekends and on school and public holidays, though this can be addressed on a case-by-case basis depending on the urgency of the matter. Please note that teachers are not obliged to share their personal phone numbers with parents or students. Parents may wish to discuss with your child's teachers their preferred mode of communication.

#### **KEEPING THE SCHOOL SAFE**

25. We seek parents' support to keep schools a safe environment for students. If your child is unwell, please ensure that he/she stays at home and seeks medical attention if necessary. If your child is recovering from respiratory-related illnesses, please encourage him/her to exercise social responsibility (e.g., by wearing a mask, minimising social interactions with big groups).

We appreciate your support and will continue to work with you closely. Let us all do our part to exercise personal and social responsibility and stay safe.

Parents/guardians will be informed if your child/ward requires follow-up appointments after the health check-up. Non-Singaporean students are requested to bring their Health Booklet and immunisation certificates (if any), to the health check-up.

#### **NRIC REGISTRATION EXERCISE**

31. The annual NRIC registration exercise will be conducted in school on 1 February 2024 (Thurs). Personnel from ICA will process the registration for all Secondary 3 students, together with selected students from other levels. More details will be provided in due course.

#### SCHOOL AND MISCELLANEOUS FEES

32. We strongly encourage parents/guardians to pay school and miscellaneous fees via GIRO. GIRO deductions will take effect in Term 1 for Secondary 2 to 4 students. However, Secondary 1 students may have to pay fees via cash/cheque/NETS/PayNow until their GIRO application is approved by the bank.
