START OF 2023 – KEY EVENTS & PROGRAMMES IN TERM 1

WELCOME BACK AND GREETINGS FOR 2023

- 1. Congratulations to the 185 new Secondary 1 students who secured a place in Crest Secondary School. I would also like to welcome our Secondary 2 to 4 Crestans back to another exciting year of learning and growth.
- 2. We are delighted to share that our 7th batch of Crestans from the Class of 2022 have performed reasonably well for the GCE N-Level Examination and the ITE Skills Subject Certificate (ISSC) courses. 95.2% of our 207 graduating students were awarded the GCE N(T) Certificate while 81.2% were awarded the ITE Skills Subject Certificate (ISSC). In addition, one in two students have secured a place in a course of their choice at ITE. We wish the Class of 2022 all the best in ITE, and like many of their seniors, progress to diploma courses at ITE/Polytechnics in the years ahead.
- 3. While COVID-19 is not fully eradicated, we have learnt to live with the challenges that the virus brings, yet not letting our guard down. For 2023, we can look forward to activities planned for all students, so that the value proposition of a unique education path in Crest can be fully experienced by all Crestans A list of these key events and programmes is shared in <u>Annex A</u>. CCA EXPOSURE PROGRAMME FOR SECONDARY 1 AND NEW TRANSFER-IN STUDENTS

All students are required to participate in one Co-Curricular Activity (CCA) as part of their holistic development. Crest offers a total of 18 CCAs – 6 Sports, 5 Aesthetic Groups, 2 Uniformed Groups and 5 Clubs. To give our Secondary 1 and new transfer-in students a better understanding of the CCAs, a CCA Exposure Programme will be conducted over three Fridays, on 6, 13 and 27 January, where students will learn about the different CCAs through hands-on activities.

REMEDIATION PROGRAMME FOR SECONDARY 2 TO 4 STUDENTS

11. Remediation programme will be conducted for selected Secondary 2 to 4 students who did not pass the English Language, Mathematics or Mother Tongue Language examinations in 2022. The programme aims to strengthen these students' academic foundation, so as to help them do better in school. The remediation programme will be held weekly and will start from 6 February 2022 (Term 1 Week 6) onwards, as follows:

13. The 2023 CNY festive holidays will stretch from 23 to 24 January (Monday & Tuesday). The school will be celebrating CNY on 20 January (Friday). Students will report to school at 7:55am and will be dismissed at 10:30am. We encourage all students to don either Chinese ethnic costumes or red tops to enhance the festive mood. School will resume on 25 January (Wednesday).

HEALTH CHECK-UP FOR STUDENTS

15. The School Health Service Team from Health Promotion Board (HPB) will be in Crest from 3 February (Friday) to 14 February (Tuesday) to conduct health check-ups for our Sec 1 to 2 students. Parents/guardians will be informed if your child/ward requires follow-up referral after the health check-up. Non-Singaporean students are requested to bring their Health Booklet and immunisation certificates (if any), to the health check-up.

HEALTHY MEALS IN SCHOOLS PROGRAMME (HMSP)/ INCREASE IN FOOD AND DRINK PRICES AND CONSUMPTION OF WATER

16. To support our students' health development, the school is on board the Healthy Meals in Schools Programme (HMSP) by the Health Promotion Board (HPB). This programme provides food service guidelines for school canteens and aims to cultivate good eating habits among our students, so that they will be accustomed to consuming fruit, vegetables and whole grains as part of their daily diet. With the rising costs, the school needs to balance the affordability of the canteen prices with the sustainability of our canteen stallholders. As such, starting 2023, there will be a 10-cent to 30-cent increase in the prices of selected food and drinks items. All prices of the set meals, sides, snacks and drinks are clearly displayed at the canteen stalls. Healthy set meals will be provided in the school canteen with prices ranging from \$2.80 to \$5.00. We seek your support and understanding in this matter, and we encourage your child/ward to eat healthily.

17. We also encourage our students to consume water on a regular basis throughout the day as our weather is hot and humid. As proper hydration is important, we strongly encourage all students to bring **their own water bottle** to school. There are many water coolers around the school where students can fill up their water bottles.

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
